



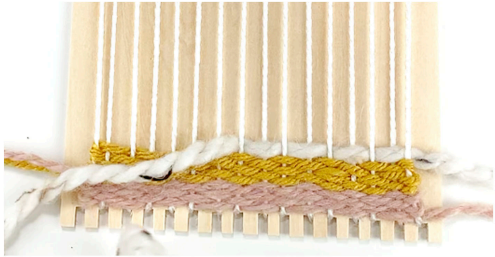
CLASSY ARTIST BOX KIDS!

WALL HANGINGS: LEVEL 4

Finished work will vary based on age and ability. See the parent's note for more details.

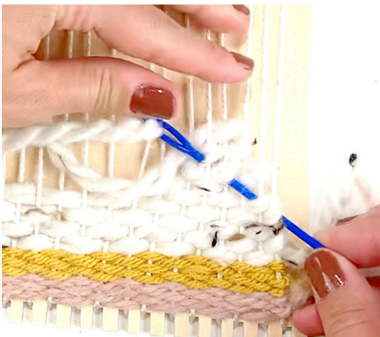
For this project, you will need a wooden dowel, yarn, 20" of jute, and a kid-safe scissors.

Warning: Adult supervision required



1. Begin with at least one or two rows, weaving all the way across. Use the under-over pattern, always choosing the opposite weave of what you did in the last row. (0:04)

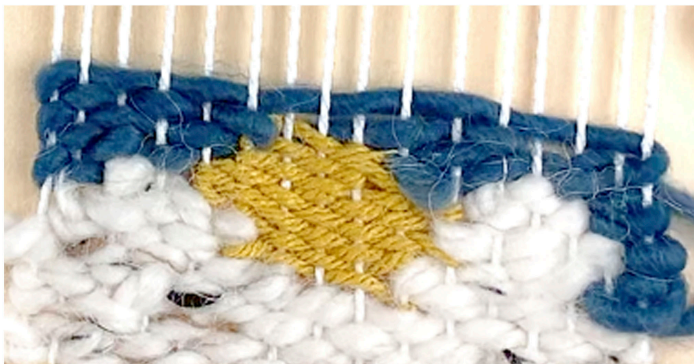
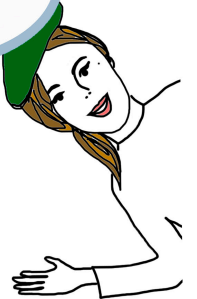
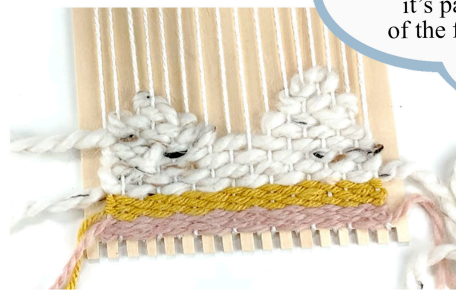
2. Decide how you want your weaving to look. You could sketch the plan out on paper if you want. Otherwise, think of a general plan in your head. Then, weave your plan! (0:17)



3. Weave the tail end into the weaving. And remember, if the tail is short, you may need to weave the needle into the fibers part of the way, then put the yarn through the eye. (1:09)

4. Make as many shapes/designs as you want using your favorite colors! (1:45)

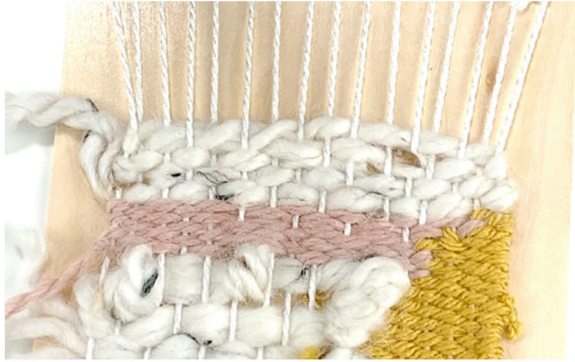
5. Fill in any areas that still need yarn. Try to work from the bottom up! (2:23)

Then, keep filling in all the empty spaces until you have a flat row across again!



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6. Decide how you want to finish your weaving. Do you want to use flat rows like stripes or continue making a design? (5:41)



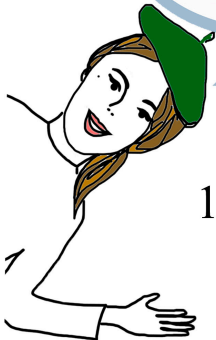
7. Optional: make some tassels! Loop some pieces of yarn into the bottom row of the weaving and tie the loose ends in knots so they will not come out! (7:46)



8. Weave the tails into the weaving. If you want, you can also watch the Tassels Mini-Lesson and see how to make some more complicated tassels, too! These will be very difficult for many of you, but it's always fun to try and see if you can make them! (9:09)

9. Sew (or loop) the weaving onto the dowel. (9:19)

To keep or not to keep? That is the question!



10. Add a jute rope to hang it up! (12:25)
