Level 1: ages 3+

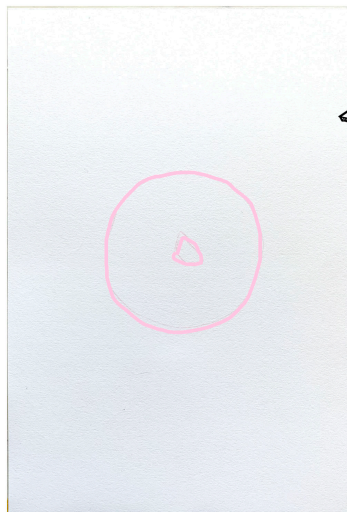


LAYOUT

Turn your paper so the longest edge is going VERTICAL (AKA the hamburger way!!!)

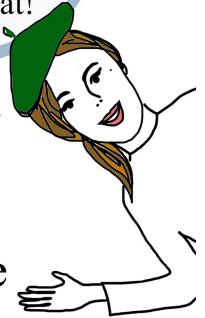
We are going to learn to draw donuts today! Along the way you will also learn tips to help you draw basically anything!!!!

1. When we want to make a picture of something, we always want to make the beginning steps as simple as possible!



Make one big circle in the center of your paper. Then make a smaller shape in the middle!

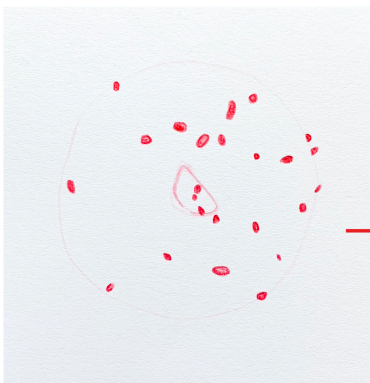
We all love sweets, but always limit the amount of sweets you eat!



DETAILS

2. With sprinkles on top!!! After you draw the basic shape, it's time to add some details!

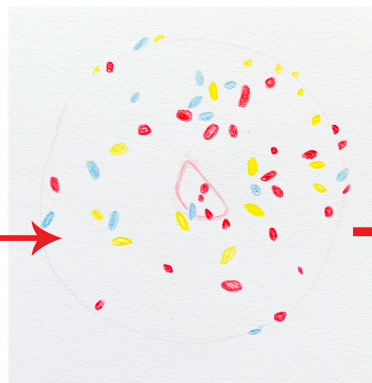
Now draw sprinkles like this: ↘



RED



YELLOW



BLUE



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PURPLE, PINK

GREEN

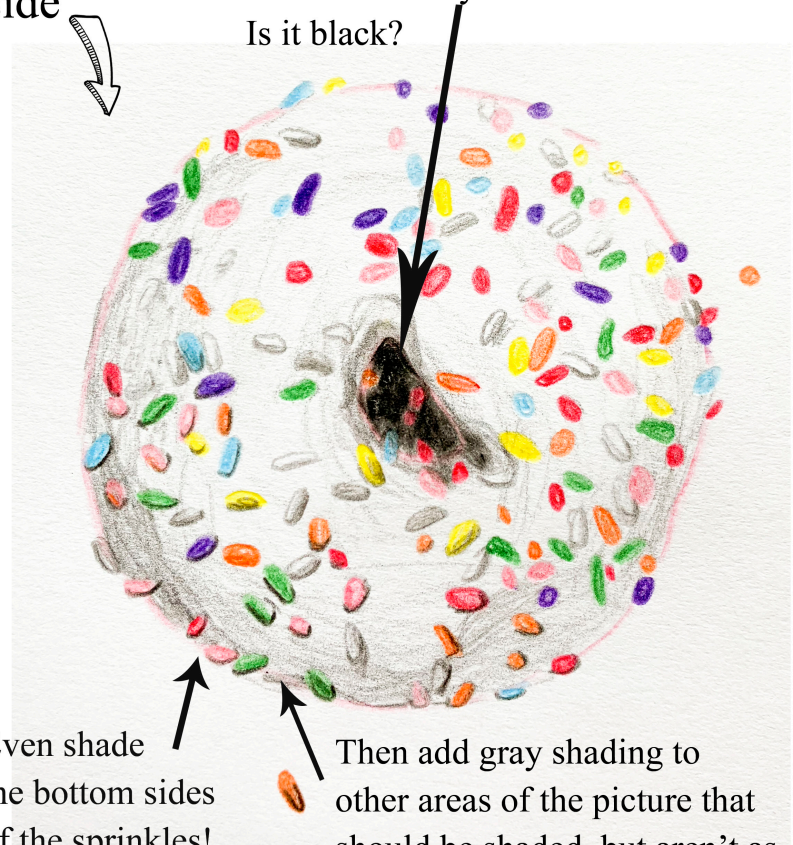
ORANGE

Level 2: ages 6+

SHADING

3. Next, we add shading to the object, person, or place we're drawing! To shade, we turn our black pencil on its side and lightly make gray shadows!

When drawing, look to see which area of your picture should be darkest! Draw that as dark as you think it should be! Is it black?



Tilt your pencil to the side to make a light, even shadow!

Even shade the bottom sides of the sprinkles!

Then add gray shading to other areas of the picture that should be shaded, but aren't as dark!





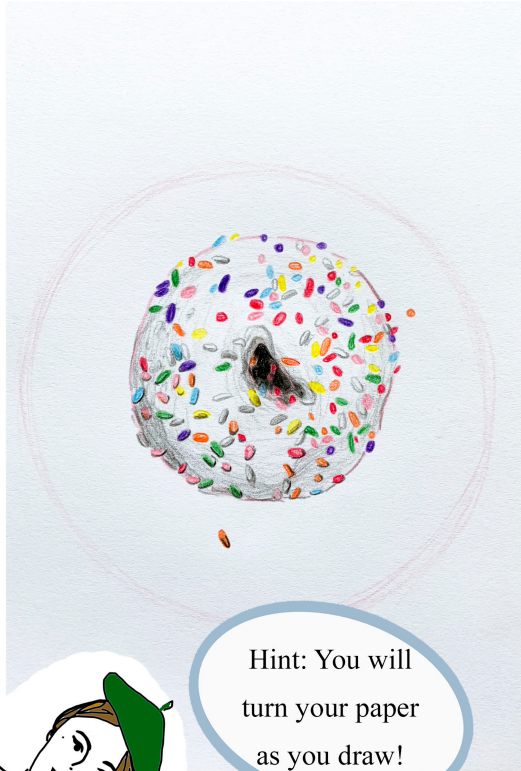

Level 3: ages 9+

BACKGROUND SHAPE (plate)

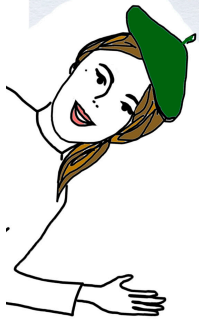
4. Now Draw circles around the donut! This will become the plate.



This can be hard so watch the video to see some tricks to help you draw them!



Hint: You will turn your paper as you draw!



5. Then, add scallops and color the plate in with your favorite color!!





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Level 4: Expert artist

BACKGROUND SHADING



6. Add shadows to the plate.

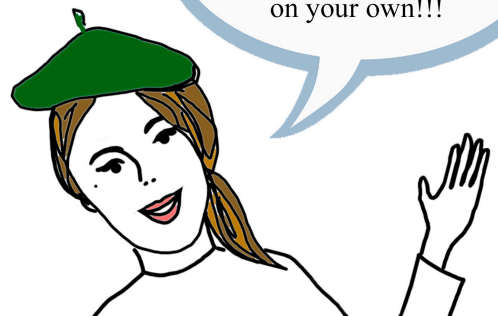
-Shade the inside edge of the plate.

-Shade toward the bottom of the donut.

-Shade under the bottom edge of the plate.

Reminder: Don't forget to turn your pencils on the side to shade evenly!

Now, use the extra supplies and pictures to make 3 more drawings on your own!!!





Your box is here!! What next?!

Click on over to ClassyArtistBox.com to log into your account (login generated when you signed up!!). Then, navigate over to the video tab and select the box of which you signed up. Click on the page and you'll see our video archive! As you and your child watch the video, we recommend pausing after each step to allow your child to complete the step before moving on.

There is a helpful navigation menu if you need to stop and come back to a step later.

Preschool AKA "Pre-Schematic" (3-5):

We know you love your kiddos to the moon and back! So we've created a fun, fantasy-filled project for them to work on! Our younger members will be able to do a basic version of this project, practice their scissors skills, and make this work of art their own!

Focus on having them simply draw the donut (and other sweet treats too) and practice those fine motor skills as they practice drawing a circle!! The simple task of drawing a shape (or at least trying) will begin helping them use gross and fine motor skills. They will also be practicing valuable cognitive skills such as spatial reasoning and identifying geometric and organic shapes and translating them into their own drawings.

Likely outcome: a simple donut with a simple or plain background!

Early Elementary AKA "Schematic" (6-8):

Our early-mid elementary members will experience this project in different ways to stretch their creativity! Some will launch themselves into it and try to complete every step and detail, while others may be totally content with a minimalistic look – both are amazing options with unique outcomes!

Focus on having them create simple & neat drawings with some shading! On the donut or other sweet treats!

Upper Elementary AKA "Pre-Teen" (9-11):

Our older members will likely be able to complete all steps to this project and some will also want to take things even further or create a different composition. **WONDERFUL!** This means your child may LAUNCH an art career! This is the age that tends to be most receptive to creative encouragement, as they may start to doubt their own work and need you to lift them up artistically. It's your job to make sure they know their art is a SWEET TREAT to look at!
