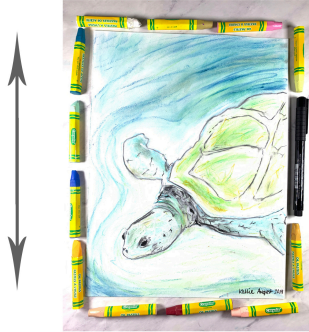


SEA TURTLE DRAWING

SHADING WITH OIL PASTELS



1. Set up your paper so that the longest side is going up and down (vertical) in front of you.

2. Use your Sky Blue pastel to draw the turtle's head shape in the bottom left-hand corner of the paper.



3. Make an eyelid by drawing an upside down smile. Then add the eye by making half of a circle under it!



4. Draw a turtle neck on the turtle by adding lots of little lines above his head.

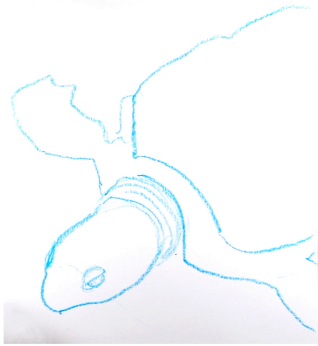


5. Now draw the turtle's legs (fins). Draw one whole one and the other will be going off the edge of the paper.

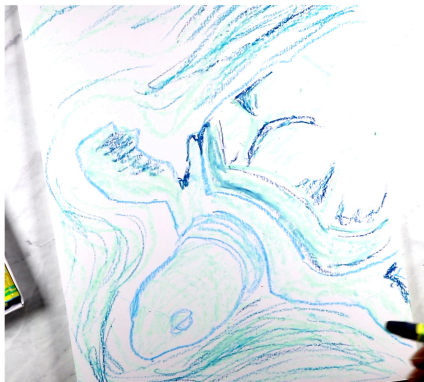
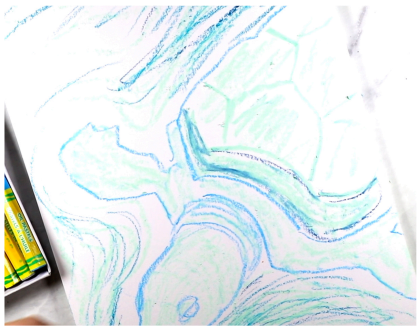
6. Now that we like how the head, neck, and arms look, we need to draw the shell!

7. Color in the turtle with Sea Green. Careful to not color over the blue lines you already made!



8. Use Sea Green and Blue Green to make water surrounding the turtle. Be sure to make the water lines wrap around the turtle so it looks like water!

9. Then use the color Blue Green again to add a few darker spots in the water below & above the turtle.



10. Now use Midnight Blue to begin shading the turtle's arms and shell, as shown in the picture. Shading is cool because it makes our picture pop out!

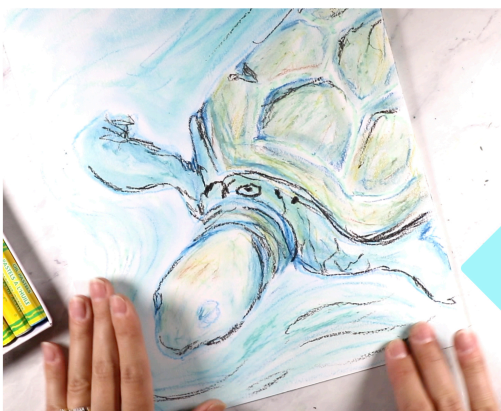
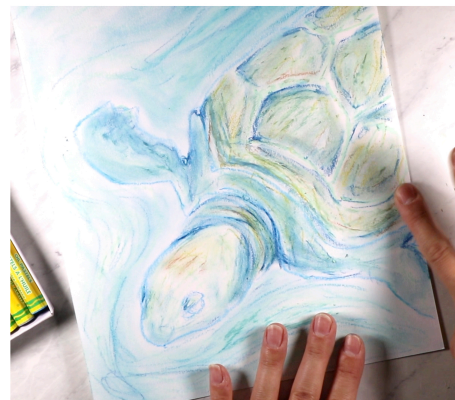
11. Add Midnight Blue to the water above and below the turtle. Also add it to the turtle shell, arms, neck, and head.

12. Take the color Golden Rod and add little scribbles of it on the head, neck, & shell.



13. Now use Brown and go lightly over the top of the head, neck, and shell.

14. Now smudge it all together with your fingers! First, start with the water and then do the turtle's head, then the body!



15. Next, use the black pastel to make the shadows darker under the arms, head, on the neck, on parts of the shell, and in the water below the turtle!

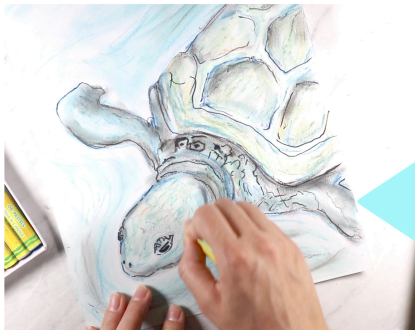
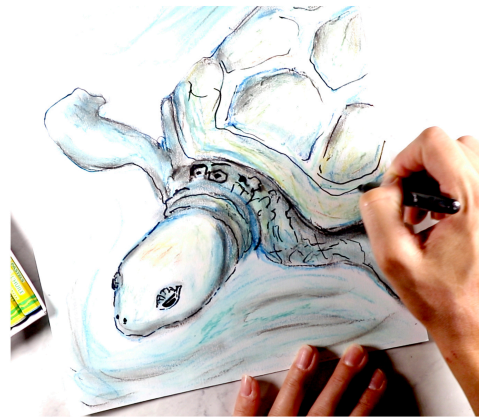

16. Now smudge it so it's nice and smooth and dark and light like this!

17. Take your Art Marker and carefully outline your turtle. Draw the little lines in the turtle's skin!



Challenge: go back over the head, shell, and arms with more colors to make it look more like the picture!

18. Use the hand wipe to clean your hands and the table where you worked!
