# Elementary ARTIST BOX



### Warm Colors

1. Paint the warm colors first: red, orange, and yellow. Start the first red arch of the rainbow near the center of the canvas, arching toward the upper right corner.

### Cool Colors

2. Paint the cool colors next: green, blue, indigo, and violet.



When we talk about the rainbow sometimes we say the colors are "ROY G. BIV." That stands for: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet.

indigo = dark blue

violet = purple



### Cloud



3. Paint a cloud under the rainbow.

Add a light shadow to the cloud by dipping your brush in a very small amount of black paint. Brush off some of the extra paint on the table cover, then add to the cloud.



4. Paint the background with blue-green (or another color of your choice that won't blend in with the rainbow).



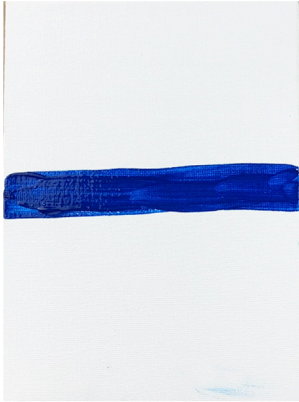
5. Let your painting dry on the table cover while cleaning your brush, water cup, and anything else needed.





# Project 2

# Elementary ARTIST BOX



### Layout

1. Paint a horizontal line in the middle of the paper.

2. Paint another horizontal line on top of the first, roughly to the middle of the first line. Keep stacking horizontal lines, each a little shorter than the last until you hit the top of the canvas.



3. Now paint the same type of lines under the initial line on the opposite half of the canvas. Make the lines shorter as you move downward.



4. Next, add white horizontal lines on the empty parts of the canvas.



### Blending

5. Blend a small section of the blue paint into the white, a little bit at a time.



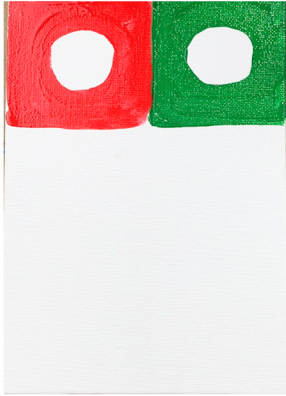
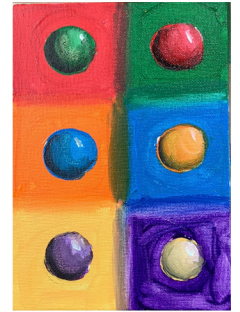
Keep blending the blue paint over toward the white paint until you have a nice gradual tint.

Remember: a tint is a lighter version of a color, made by adding white.





# Project 3 Elementary ARTIST BOX



### Background

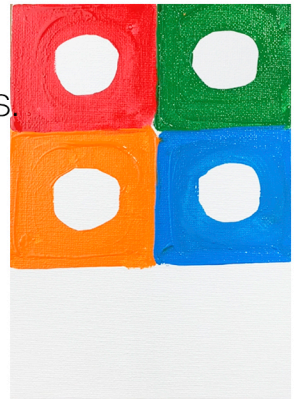


1. Paint a square in the upper left-hand side of the canvas. Leave a blank center circle.

2. Next, paint a green square with an empty circle in the upper right-hand side of the canvas.

3. Paint an orange square with an empty circle under the red square.

4. Paint a blue square with an empty circle under the green square.

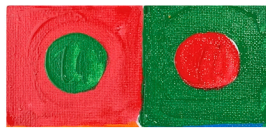


5. Paint a yellow square with an empty circle under the orange square.

6. Paint a purple square with an empty circle under the blue square.



### Complimentary Colors



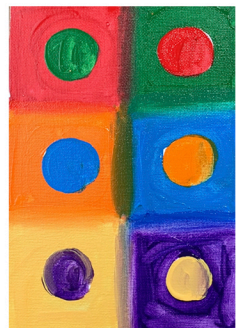
7. Paint a green circle in the red square and a red circle in the green.



8. Paint a blue circle in the orange square and an orange circle in the blue.

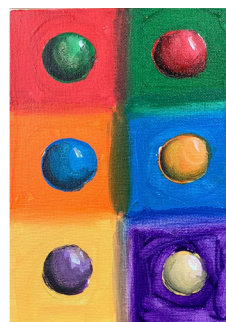
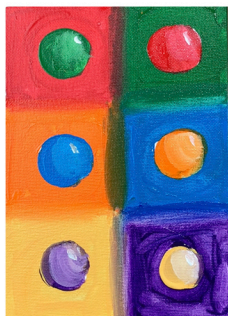


9. Paint a purple circle in the yellow square and a yellow circle in the purple.



10. If you want to try blending the complimentary colors into brown, blend the lines between the squares. To do this, the paint will need to be a little wet still. Then, take a clean brush and blend between the lines.

11. Add a small amount of white paint on the upper right-hand side of the circles. Blend it lightly.



12. Now add light shadows with a small bit of black paint under the bottom left-hand side of the circles.





# Project 4

# Elementary ARTIST BOX



## Background



1. Decide what color to paint the background. Then, paint it, leaving an empty spot for the pear!

2. Now add a shadow to the ground under the right side of the pear. Blend. Also add a darker line for a horizon line and blend.



3. Paint the pear green.

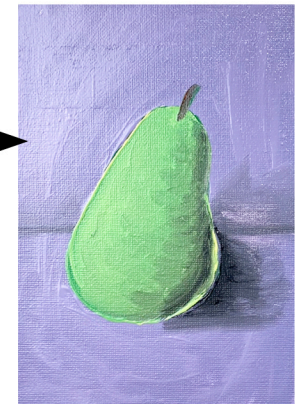


4. Paint yellow over the green pear and let the green and yellow blend together.



5. Add a brown stem to the top of the pear!

6. Add a bit of black paint to the right edge of the pear and blend it gently toward the center of the pear.



7. Add details to make the pear look more realistic. Speckle light brown, yellow, & green dots.



8. Add a bit of white into the top left corner of the canvas to show where the light is coming from.

9. Lighten the tabletop on the left side of the canvas and blend it in. Leave the shadows.



10. Add a highlight to the pear with a small bit of white paint and water. Blend.

11. Add more details with brown paint by dabbing small dots on the pear.





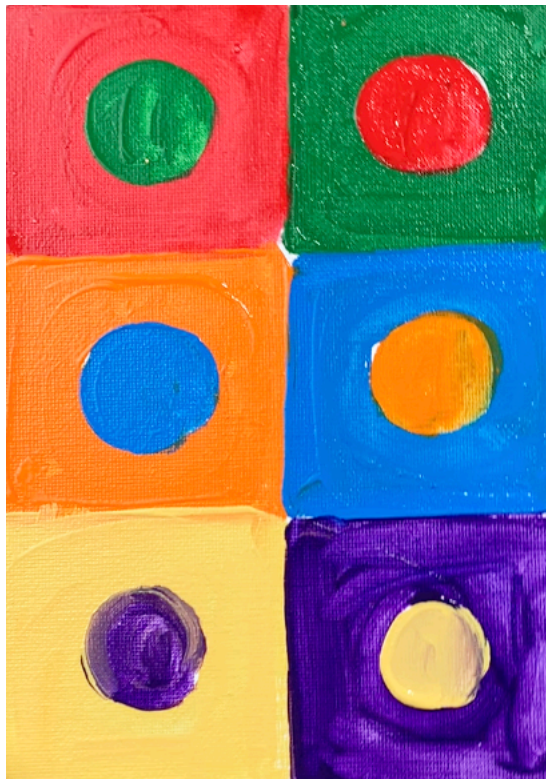




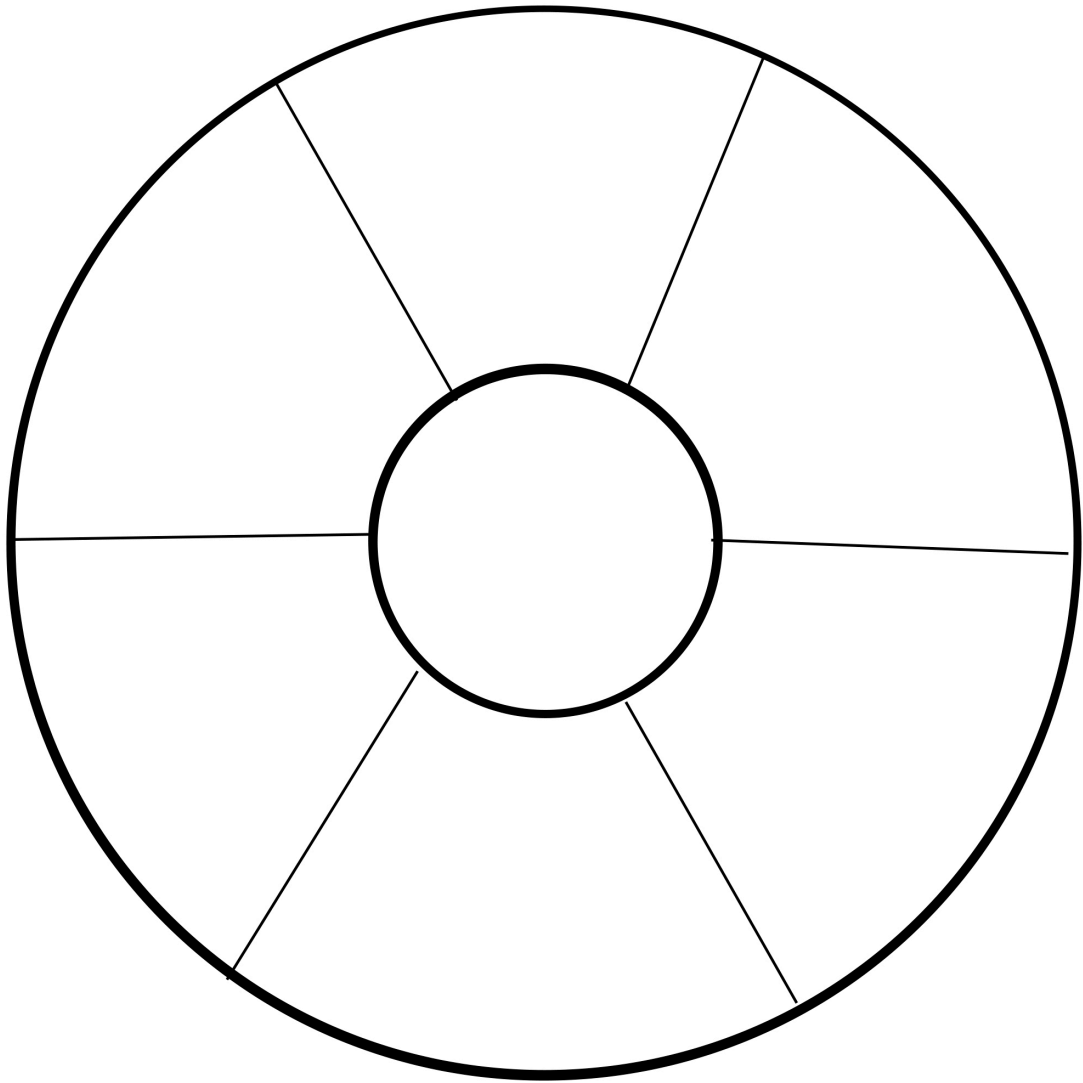
