



## Watercolor Resist Spring Moon



1. Use a color of Cray-Pas crayon to outline a circle as the moon. In the example, we are using the white crayon so that the outline is a surprise until we add the watercolor paint!

2. Add stars or swirls around the outside of the moon.

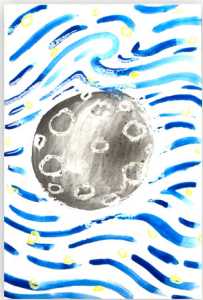
3. Once your stars and moon are in place, use the watercolors to add color to the moon!



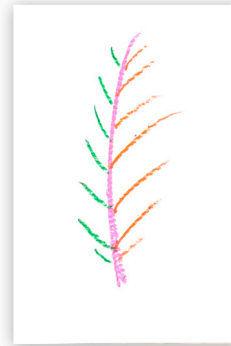
If you want to make your moon pop, use the paint to add an extra dimension so there is a slight shadow.



4. Make a background in the sky using wave-like lines or brush strokes.



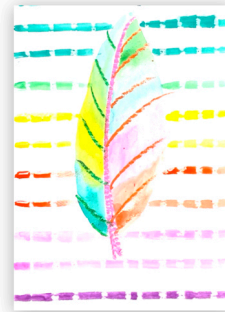
## Watercolor Resist Feather



1. Set out your table cover. Then take your Cray-Pas and draw the vertical line of your feather. Choose your colors and if you are sharing a box you may get to take turns.

2. Then, use other colors of Cray-Pas to make little feather-y lines coming out from the center line of the feather.

3. Fill your watercup with a few inches of water and use that to activate the watercolor paint so that you can create a multi-colored feather. Decide what color scheme you like and use those colors to create the feather you want to see.



4. Design your background pattern any way you think looks good.



5. Finally, let your painting dry and consider using Cray-Pas over top of the painting for added layers of design and detail.
