



## Cork Collage



1. Take your cork background out and prepare your remaining collage supplies. This collage could use any of the remaining colors of paper.

2. Design your idea and decide whether you will copy this example or make your own. Draw your idea on the paper and figure out which pieces you will need to cut out.



3. Cut or rip the paper into the shapes you need.



4. Arrange the design on your cork first before gluing thing down to make sure you like your design. Then, make any changes needed.



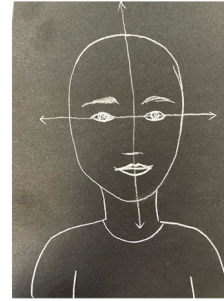
5. Glue everything down in layers starting with what should be in the background first and working your way forward.



6. What else can you add to make this project unique to you?

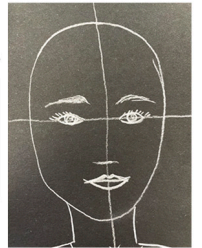


## Self Portrait Yarn Collage



1. Watch the Scissors Safety video. Then, set out your table cover. Take out your black sheet of paper, favorite color of yarn that came in your box, your scissors, pencil, and glue.

2. Draw your own self-portrait on your paper with your pencil. The pencil will show up lightly on the black paper.



Note: younger kids might just be able to draw the basics like a circular head, eyes, nose, hair, and mouth. BUT, if ready, try using the Portrait Rules as a guide.



3. Check your portrait to see if it looks right to you. Make changes.



4. Next, add glue to the lines you drew as your portrait in Step Two. Add yarn on top of the glue as you go.



5. Keep adding to your picture by filling in areas of your portrait with more details or colors of yarn.



6. Finally, press the yarn down onto the glue as it dries.
